(Condensed Version)

COCC would like to acknowledge that the beautiful land our campuses reside on, are the original homelands of the **Wasq'ú** (Wasco), and the **Wana Łama** (Warm Springs) people. They ceded this land to the US government in the Treaty of 1855. The **Numu** (Paiute) people were forcibly moved to the Warm Springs Indian Reservation starting in 1879. It is also important to note that the Klamath Trail ran north through this region to the great Celilo Falls trading grounds and the Klamath Tribes claim it as their own. Descendants of these original people are thriving members of our communities today. We acknowledge and thank the original stewards of this land.

A. Background

Elaine Mooers was one of the original donors of land used to establish the COCC Bend Campus. Ms. Mooers donated 20 acres in what is now the southwest portion of the campus. Staff are working on a plan to design and install a formal plaque acknowledging all donors of land which led to the establishment of the Bend campus. (Original donors included: The Bend Motorcycle Club, the Coats, Mooers and Vandevert families, and Deschutes County.)

While Elaine has since passed away, her daughter Suzanne and son-in-law Gary still live in Bend and reached out in the summer of 2022 hoping to have the College and the Board formally recognize the family's donation as this was not done when it was completed in 1962.

Central Oregon Community College Monthly Budget Status Highlights of December 2022 Financial Statements

Cash and Investments

The College's operating cash balances currently total \$46.5 million. The December average yield for the Local Government Investment Pool increased to 3.04 percent from last report of 2.1.

General Fund Revenues

Winter term registration continues, resulting in an increase in tuition and fee revenues of \$1.4 million over the prior month. The budgeted transfers-in have been posted for the year.

General Fund Expenses

The expenses through December 2022 include the required budgeted inter-fund transfers-out for the fiscal year.

Budget Compliance

All general fund appropriation categories are within budget.
