Students: Could you use help paying for food each month?



Students 18-49 who attend higher education at least half time may be eligible for SNAP – Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – by meeting income guidelines and additional criteria.

1. INCOME: Those who fall below Oregon's Income Guidelines may be eligible for SNAP:

Monthly amounts go up \$642 for each additional person.

Other factors affecting eligibility:

- Students cannot be participating in any school meal plan.
- Students on a break from school must still meet student criteria.
- Students under the age of 22, still living at home, must apply with their family.
- Financial aid received through the Veterans Administration or private scholarships count as income.

How to Apply for SNAP

- 1. You have options:
 - Complete and submit an application online at https://apps.state.or.us/onlineApplication, or
 - Walk into a DHS SNAP office and pick up, fill out, and turn in a paper application. Most offices are offering same day or next day service. Find your nearest SNAP office by calling 2-1-1 or visiting www.oregon.gov/DHS/assistance/Pages/localoffices.aspx



- 2. A SNAP eligibility worker will meet with you either in person or over the phone. You will need:
 - Identification (such as a drivers license)
 - Social Security numbers for everyone applying (original cards not required)
 - Proof of income for the last 30 days (such as check stubs)
 - A copy of your work study award letter, if applicable.
