Key Concepts

Compliance

- Compliance is an institutional obligation.
- All schools must have coordinating official(s).

Internal Controls

- Distinct separation of duties assigned to specific offices.
- Management of cash to prevent fraud and abuse
- Program integrity to protect ensure proper management of federal funds

Administrative Capability

The ability of offices at a college or university to accurately coordinate their work to meet federal deadlines. This includes communication and training to meet federal obligations.




Financial Aid (a very short list)



Student Eligibility

Making sure only eligible students receive aid.



Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students are making progress on their educational goals.



Curricular Eligibility

Making sure majors and individual courses meet federal minimums.



Cost of Attendance

Constructing student budgets for different classes of students.



Return to Title IV

Checking enrollment and initiation of attendance and returning funds



Disbursement and Overawards

Making sure financial aid is applied to accounts, the amount is accurate, and timely reported to COD.





Admissions



Eligible to be admitted

Check high school completion, student is eligible to attend college.



Initial Transcript (Maybe)

Determines articulation and acceptance of credit towards degree.



Student Type

Determines what kind of student enters the school: undergrad, post-bacc, grad



Determines Degree Seeking

Certifies that students are seeking a degree or certificate.





Registration (Registrar)



Enrollment

Students enrolled in for credit courses.



Veterans Benefits

Typically certifying veterans benefits which can interact with Financial Aid



Reporting

Reporting students' enrollment levels to NSC and/or NSLDS.



Residency and Fees

Determining the correct rate for each student based on course charges





Student Accounts (Business Office)



Manage Student Bill

Make sure the charges are true and accurate for each student. Post charges.



Set up Fee Tables and Tuition Rates

Making sure majors and individual courses meet federal minimums.



Disbursement

Initiate direct payments to students for Title IV credit balances.



Request/Return funds

Drawdown funds and return excess funds to the Federal G5 (G6 in the near future) account.




Returns Funds

Returns funds from R2T4

Curriculum Approval



Determines New Programs

Reports newly approved programs to financial aid. Sends to state and NWCCU.



Approves New Courses

Adds and updates new courses for instruction. Sends these to State/NWCCU






Instructors



Grades

Grades are used to determine SAP progress. Students must maintain a 2.0.



Initiation of Attendance

Students must attend at least one session of a course (or complete an activity online) for it to be considered attempted.




Last Date of Attendance

Students who are assigned a non-passing grade must also be assigned a last date of attendance. Used in R2T4 calculations

Annually checking for compliance and appropriate management of funds



The State of Oregon

Reporting for OOG, OPG, and scholarship payments



The Foundation

Donor agreements, fund rules and appropriate management of money



Departmental Awards

Application of strategic enrollment and retention funds from departments



External Scholarship Providers

Reporting and funds management rules for each kind of fund.



Hardship and Emergency Funding

Emergency money to students in need






Other Important Players, Cont'd



Athletics

Tons of discounts and scholarships, with a whole other set of NCAA rules.



Strategic Enrollment

Tuition discounting and enrollment targeting of specific populations



Title IX

Investigations that can result in credit balances, refunds of aid



Department of Education

Weekly and daily new guidance and instructions for compliance



Public Safety

Clery Act and Fire Safety reporting for required consumer information


