- Drop in lab for Auto CAD is kind of limited. I would like to see a trusted individual too oversee more lab time for students. I know it is difficult for the instructors to be near by as often as needed.
- should be five cents to print.
- I have had a few issues while trying to register for classes, like not being able to sign on, or get to the page to register because I get kicked off.
- I wish the pay for print would take change. Black board is good but inconsistently used by teachers and it's one more password to remember. There are so many places a teacher will put grades (or not put grades). The textbook ordering system is convenient but could be more convenient if the student secedule feature was more intragrated with it so when you add a class it will tell you what books are required (on the same page), then have a link to ordering it. I really like the speed and capabilities of the computer lab computers.
- Campus wireless is slow for personal computers (ie. laptops)
- The college web site is not very organized and it takes forever to find stuff on it.
- It's so helpful to be able to have off-campus access to research databases. For the most part, communicating between the campus system (PC) and my Mac has worked really well, very few problems sending and opening files.
- Overall, I have had little problems with the campus network and blackboard however I would like to see better intergration with less used software such as firefox and ubuntu (linux) operating system
- I came back to school after a 6-year break. Everything had changed! I had problems getting internet service where I live, and it was really frustrating to have to find open wireless service close to home at the hours I had available to do homework. I did a lot of driving from one coffee shop to another. I had no idea how to even submit my very first homework assignment on blackboard, and I had no clue that submitting it online was expected. When I registered for school that first term back, I had no idea I would absolutely have to have a computer, access to the internet, and that so much was done online for "traditional" classroom courses. I was not happy about all of this and wrote a letter to Gordon Price (e-mail), but never got a reply. Maybe I didn't send it correctly.

I am especially frustrated when quizzes and tests are given on blackboard. I don't think it should be used for testing at all. In my experience so far, questions are often poorly worded and there is no one to ask for an interpretation. You can e-mail your instructor, but you don't know when you will get your answer. Also, sometimes there is more than one acceptable answer, but blackboard only recognizes one. So I sometimes feel like I'm throwing darts at a dart board hoping to hit the bullseye eventually. This has occurred in Chemistry and CIS 120 several times.

And about the use of graphing calculators. I guess it is necessary to know how to use one, but I am surprised that a portion of math courses is dedicated just on how to use the calculator. I am grateful that it is part of our math instruction, since it would take me longer to figure it out myself, but it's more about pushing buttons than learning math.

Graphing calculators, computers, and internet service are expensive. I know of at least one person who didn't register for college because he didn't have a computer and could not get internet service where he lived. I am 37 and behind in technology. I have met other older students in the same situation. I have heard of people dropping classes because of the technology barrier. Technology changes so quickly! How can we all keep up?

- The on-line bookstore does not list the ISBN of the books you are trying to order. Without seeing the books, the ISBN is the only way to make sure you are ordering the correct book.
- registration process could be more fluid, click on lists as opposed to searches, and it would help if a graphic representation of potential weekly class schedule was available.
- some information in unecessarily difficult to find on the cocc website. Information about jobs and scholarships should be easier to locate.
- The campus wireless signal goes out pretty often. COCC has a very poor online set up. It is a hassel to log into several diffrent systems, ie student services, blackboard, and email. There should be one main login page and links to the other pages. It is a complete waste of time to go back and forth between pages.
- Off campus use of databases often get booted off which is frustrating if you are mid-search. Other than that it is great to have some much information available so easily both on and off campus.

class. I would use two monitors. This became a huge issue with the lab staff because they did not want me to take up two computers. The college computers have DW3 I ordered new software DW4 so I was trying to work with a newer program than what the college had. (DW4 was what was available to buy) I ended up just coming up to the college because I was so confused. I was beside myself trying to figure this program out. I felt like I did not get any understanding or assistance from the lab staff. I felt like there was no support around this course and the computer lab rules did not allow me to do use two monitors. It was also a major issue to get headphones. I started out by trading in my keys and then one day they said I could only get a pair of headphones with my school ID. I just found the whole thing ridiculous and not student friendly. At one point I came in and sat down in a chair that flopped backwards. I told the computer attendant that the chair was broke. She told me it was fine.
