Provided Overview: “I am working with the OCCA on campus advocacy, and a key topic is the state funding for community colleges. The initial phase of this process is seeking to have the Governor’s budget include \$787 million in the state budget. In each legislative cycle – every two years – the traditional kick-off to the budget season is the release of the Governor’s budget which comes in December. That is the starting point in the process. Once released, the budget then moves to the Legislature where over a period of approximately six months it is worked on and refined, and finally passed by the Legislature. My discussion with ASCOCC will focus on the \$787 million ask of the Governor and sending letters to the Governor on that request.”

Discussion Notes

- The COCC funding pool is generated from three main sources:
 - Tuition (students)
 - Property Taxes (local)
 - State Funding (state)
- As property taxes go up, state funding goes down.
 - “Equity” based, different property taxes for each district
- Oregon Community College Assoc. (OCCA) has requested that member campus constituents help to provide testimony/letters for more funding
- OCCA + Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) has asked for \$787 mil. from
 - \$70 mil = CTE Programs
- Gov. Brown wants to focus funding allocation on K-12, no mention of post-2nd in her budget statements thus far
- For ASCOCC reps, make statements on behalf of the student body, advocate for our constituents
- Student Lobbying Day, set up through OCCA specifically for CC students to testify (be prepared around January 2019)
- Postcard campaign for students? Accessibility? Start on preemptive work, prepare for post-election action
- OCCA is made up of 17 community colleges. Opt-in, membership based
- Gov. Brown will release budget mid-Dec., updates to come
