Sustainability Conference:

Owen Murphy, chair of sustainability committee giving briefing. Took a group of students to Eugene three years ago for a regional conference, discusses curriculum and operations as well as social movements related to sustainability. Have had the conference the last two years online and are offering it again in person this year in Corvallis.

Wishes to take a group of students to the conference, had applied to COCC for financial assistant, was declined. Is now asking ASCOCC for financial assistance. Will be taking a van from COCC and will be gone Monday – Wednesday. Registration, lodging, and registration grand total for eight students would \$3,519. Is willing to lower amount of students taken to decrease price cost. Price adjusted to \$3,200 after subtracting transportation.

ASCOCC has proposed for students to file Professional Development funds which will cover their registration fees, bringing down grand total to \$2,400.

ASCOCC has decided that students will earn the funds from Professional Development are not required to fill out the form and essay beforehand due to the short notice, they are approved for the funds but will have to provide a reflection piece after the conference.

Mal Sotelo motioned the approval; Oscar Tovar seconded. ASCOCC unanimously voted to approve the funding of the trip.

Asian Cultures Club Lunar New Year:

Have asked for \$700 worth of funding to organize and plan the event, involving dumpling making and a small performance. Motion to approve was brought forward by Kylie Willstatter, seconded by Ryan Rhodes. ASCOCC unanimously voted to approve.

Redmond Recruitment Event:

Jacqueline Ruggieri is asking for \$15 funding. Mal Sotelo motioned the approval, Jessie Spendlove seconded. ASCOCC unanimously voted to approve.

ECE Conference:

Early Childhood Education Conference, staff members work to plan it and are inviting students to attend conference. Amy Howell has asked ASCOCC to fund the student's registration fees, which would be around \$3,000. This would not be applicable for professional development due to the nature of the financial charges.

ASCOCC discussed putting a limit on how many students they would cover the registration fee for, have discussed paying for up to 40 students.

Dilynn Campbell motioned to approve funding for 40 students, Oscar Tovar seconded. ASCOCC unanimously voted to approve to pass.

Vegas Conference:

Hesitations are brought forward as it would be a very quick conference. Grand total is looking to be around \$5,700 - \$6,800.

ASCOCC voted to attend the conference but leave on Thursday rather than Friday so that the council could visit other student councils while in Las Vegas. Mal Sotelo motioned to approve the funding; Ryan Rhodes seconded the motion.
